

ANOTHER FRONTIER: FREDERIC REMINGTON'S EAST

Frederic Remington's art has profoundly shaped our perceptions of the Old West that we only vaguely, if at all, recall that he was an Easterner born and bred. He grew up in Canton and Ogdensburg, New York—the North Country, the forested region stretching from the Adirondack Mountains across



the St. Lawrence River into Canada. The artwork on view, on loan from the Frederic Remington Art Museum in Ogdensburg, New York, shifts the focus from Remington's popular Western imagery to his less familiar Eastern subjects, inviting visitors to expand their knowledge of the iconic artist.
